	<p style="text-align: center;">117.1. INSTRUCTION AT HOME FOR DISRUPTIVE STUDENTS (NONSPECIAL EDUCATION)</p> <p>1. Authority SC 1901-C</p> <p>Pol. 233</p> <p>2. Guidelines</p> <p>Pol. 117</p> <p>The school district shall provide, pursuant to laws and regulations regarding disruptive student’s behavior, students under expulsions and alternative education programs, Instruction at Home due to excessive disruptive behavior; offenses involving danger to person or persons; offenses against property; offenses against public order and decency; and/or offenses against orderly operation of the school.</p> <p>The procedure will work in conjunction with Board policy 233 and all other related student discipline policies and shall be used on a temporary basis or long-term basis for an alternative educational program in order to meet the needs of the student.</p> <p>After careful consideration, the principals or designee under consultation with staff describe the reasons and goals for the Instruction at Home (IAH) program and shall complete an application for IAH and for alternative education.</p> <p>The Superintendent or designee will develop procedures and forms as outlined in Board policy 117 with a minimum of five (5) hours per week (one (1) hour for each subject area) or as directed by the principal. The Superintendent can consider more hours with approval. IAH is generally established at the student’s home but other mutually agreed upon sites may be considered with principal approval.</p> <p>The principal reserves the right to withhold instruction at home when:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The instructor’s presence in the place of a student’s confinement presents a hazard to the health of the teacher.</li> <li>2. A parent/guardian or other adult in authority is not present with the student during the hours of instruction.</li> <li>3. The condition of the student precludes any benefits from such instruction.</li> </ol>
